school to attend the IPSC service project "PARMATHAM" which was held from 2nd November to 5th November. It was a service program which comprised of different skill based activities held during the chores of 3 days which contributed towards the betterment of the society. We reached MGD school by

evening of 2nd November and attended the opening ceremony in which all the students were divided in different teams namely मुस्कान, पहल, दिशा, परमार्थ, सद्भाव, ऊर्जा, संकल्प, निष्ठा, चैतन्य, सेवा। We played different fun games in our respective groups. Arpan and Karnika won the game of making longest chain using their belongings. Our 1st day started with an energetic aerobic session which was conducted by Ma'am Sunaina. Then the students in their respective groups went to learn different skill based



activities which included making Tie and Dye Scarfs, Resin Key Chains, Gel Candles, making puppets and table clothes followed by a workshop on charcoal and soft pastel painting conducted by Art Forte.



In the evening we were addressed by Lt. Col. Utsav Singh (SM) who shared his personal experiences and motivated us with his words. After the session we went to the mall and had a pizza party.

Second day started with a banger as we went for trekking and nature walk in the Mountaineering and Adventure Institute of Rajasthan at Jhalana hills.

Then we went to Anna's Back to School NGO, Government school, Old age home and school for underprivileged children. Then after having our brunch we had closing ceremony which was graced by the presence of Rajkumar and Rajkumari who are the decedents of Maharani Gayatri Devi and also the founders of many different NGOs. The students of blind school also sang a beautiful song for us.



We were informed that the school raised 30,000 rupees from the sale of the craft articles we made on the 1st day and also that the money will be donated to the NGOs in the name of social service and humanity. We also received our participation certificate in this ceremony.

This concluded our journey at MGD school, Jaipur. We started our journey back to school at 2 pm and reached by 9:10pm.
